
COOKIES POLICY

BACKGROUND:

This website **www.pomanda.com** ("Our Site") uses Cookies and similar technologies in order to distinguish you from other users. We are able to provide you with a better experience by, and if you agree, using Cookies to better understand how you use Our Site. Please read this Cookie Policy carefully and ensure that you understand it. Your acceptance of our use of Cookies is deemed to mean acceptance of our Cookies Policy whenever you use Our Site. If you do not agree to Our Cookie Policy, please stop using Our Site immediately.

1. Definitions and Interpretation

1.1 In this Cookie Policy, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the following meanings:

"Cookie"	means a small file placed on your computer or device by Our Site when you visit certain parts of Our Site and/or when you use certain features of Our Site;
"Local Storage"	means a small file placed on your computer or device by Our Site when you visit certain parts of Our Site and/or when you use certain features of Our Site; The data is not sent back to the server for every HTTP request (HTML, images, JavaScript, CSS, etc) - reducing the amount of traffic between client and server.
"Cookie Law"	means the relevant parts of the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003 and of EU Regulation 2016/679 General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR");
"personal data"	means any and all data that relates to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified from that data, as defined by EU Regulation 2016/679 General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR"); and
"We/Us/Our"	means FinFind Ltd, a limited company registered in England under company number 09681085, whose registered address is Waterhouse Square, 138 Holborn, London, EC1N 2SW, and trading as "Pomanda".

2. How Does Our Site Use Cookies?

2.1 Our Site may place and access certain first party Cookies and Local Storage on your computer or device. First party Cookies and Local Storage are those placed directly by Us and are used only by Us. We use Cookies to facilitate and improve your experience of Our Site and to provide and improve Our products and Our services. We have carefully chosen these Cookies and have taken steps to ensure that your privacy and personal data is protected and respected at all times.

2.2 By using Our Site, you may also receive certain third party Cookies on your computer or device. Third party Cookies are those placed by websites, services, and/or parties other than Us.

2.3 All Cookies used by and on Our Site are used in accordance with current Cookie Law.

We may use some or all of the following types of Cookie:

2.3.1 Strictly Necessary Cookies

A Cookie falls into this category if it is essential to the operation of Our Site,

supporting functions such as logging in, your shopping basket, and payment transactions.

2.3.2 Analytics Cookies

It is important for Us to understand how you use Our Site, for example, how efficiently you are able to navigate around it, and what features you use. Analytics Cookies enable us to gather this information, helping Us to improve Our Site and your experience of it.

2.3.3 Functionality Cookies

Functionality Cookies enable Us to provide additional functions to you on Our Site such as personalisation and remembering your saved preferences. Some functionality Cookies may also be strictly necessary Cookies, but not all necessarily fall into that category.

2.3.4 Targeting Cookies

It is important for Us to know when and how often you visit Our Site, and which parts of it you have used (including which pages you have visited and which links you have visited). As with analytics Cookies, this information helps us to better understand you and, in turn, to make Our Site and advertising more relevant to your interests. Some information gathered by targeting Cookies may also be shared with third parties.

2.3.5 Third Party Cookies

Third party Cookies are not placed by Us; instead, they are placed by third parties that provide services to Us and/or to you. Third party Cookies may be used by advertising services to serve up tailored advertising to you on Our Site, or by third parties providing analytics services to Us (these Cookies will work in the same way as analytics Cookies described above).

2.3.6 Persistent Cookies

Any of the above types of Cookie may be a persistent Cookie. Persistent Cookies are those which remain on your computer or device for a predetermined period and are activated each time you visit Our Site.

2.3.7 Session Cookies

Any of the above types of Cookie may be a session Cookie. Session Cookies are temporary and only remain on your computer or device from the point at which you visit Our Site until you close your browser. Session Cookies are deleted when you close your browser.

- 3.3 The analytics service(s) used by Our Site use(s) analytics Cookies to gather the required information.
- 3.4 To deactivate the use of Third Party Cookies you may wish to visit your user settings page on Our Site to manage the use of these types of Cookies to refuse the setting or all or some of these types of Cookies. However, in doing so you may find that you are unable to access all or parts of Our Site. Please also refer to Section 4 below for additional information on control of the Cookies on Our Site.

4. Consent and Control

- 4.1 To use Our Site you must have confirmed your acceptance of the use of Cookies.
- 4.2 You can choose to enable or disable Cookies in your internet browser. Most internet browsers also enable you to choose whether you wish to disable all Cookies or only third party Cookies. By default, most internet browsers accept Cookies but this can be changed. For further details, please consult the help menu in your internet browser or the documentation that came with your device.
